

Be Prepared for Class!

Preparation for Class

- At the time of sign-up you must buy a pattern. Many of you like to read it through before the class, so that you are a bit familiar with the technique.
- ♦ Every class includes a fabric and equipment requirement sheet from your teacher. Please read it carefully and ensure that you BRING EVERYTHING THAT YOU NEED to your class. This is to make the class go smoothly for everyone. You must always bring your own rotary cutter as ours get a lot of use and are often not as sharp as you would like.
- Every class includes a "pre-class prep" list. It is essential that you read this and follow the instructions.
- Needles, threads and notions should be purchased before the class. This can be done if you arrive early, but it is not fair to the teacher or other students if she has to start the class as a teacher and then become the shopkeeper.
- ♦ It is always essential to arrive well before the start time so that you can set up your machine, get organised and do last minute shopping if needed, while I am here to help you.
- We are always here to help if you have problems before the class happens. Many teachers give out their phone numbers too, as they are willing and eager to help to ensure the class runs smoothly.
- Generally weeknight classes start at 6:00pm Saturdays are 9:00am to 4:00pm as we close at 5:00pm. Sundays start at 9:00am and finish at 4:00pm
- Finally please ARRIVE EARLY so that the class can start on time, or even a few minutes early if everyone is present and ready.







- Cost of machine rental is \$35 per day or \$15 for half a day or less.
- ♦ The rental machine must be booked and paid for at the time of class registration. In the event you wish to cancel either the machine rental or the class, you will recover full credit for your payment only if we receive the cancellation **7 days before the class date.**
- At the time you book the sewing machine, you must make an appointment for a brief instruction on the use of the machine.
- The machine is kept on the shop premises at all times. You may not take it home.
- ♦ You must provide your **own thread, machine needles,** personal sewing equipment and supplies. Any bobbins that you use must be left with the machine at the end of the rental period.
